The building of the Tunnerminnerwait and Maulboyheenner monument has begun. If you're in the Melbourne CBD, go down and have a look (corner Franklin St and Victoria Pde – opposite the Old Melbourne Gaol). The Melbourne City Council has organised an Official Opening for:

**2:00pm Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> September  
at the monument site**

It is important all those people who have attended the yearly celebrations join us on the day. Without your efforts Tunnerminnerwait and Maulboyheenner would still be a footnote in Australian history.

The significance of this monument goes far beyond its presence.

When the Gurindji walked off Vestey's and began their sit down strike 50 years ago, it heralded the beginning of the modern Land Rights Movement.

When the High Court in 1992 (almost 25 years ago) found, as a result of Eddie Mabo's historic legal challenge, that Native Title had not been extinguished by the colonisation process, Land Rights were put at the centre of political debate in this country.

The establishment of the Tunnerminnerwait and Maulboyheenner monument in the CBD of a major Australian city to men who paid the ultimate price for resisting the colonisation process, puts the Frontier Wars at the forefront of the reconciliation process between indigenous and non-indigenous Australians. Publicly recognising the resistance against colonisation is pivotal to kick starting a stalled reconciliation process that is based on justice, not charity.

This journey began in 2004 as a result of the white washing of the brutality of the colonisation process by powerful political and media forces in this country who almost succeeded in their attempts to deny this country has a black history. It has been a long journey that has taken many twists and turns. It is important those people involved in that journey are recognised and not written out of the historical record.
